

ACTS OF THE COUNCIL  
October 14, 1991

The City Council of the Town of Pine Mountain met in regular session on the evening of October 14, 1991 at seven o'clock P. M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor James V. Edgar presided with Councilpersons J. R. Beall, Franklin D. Boykin, P. C. Holladay, Vance C. Smith and Patricia E. Sullivan in attendance.

Minutes - September 9 and 26, 1991:

Upon motion by Ms. Sullivan, seconded by Mr. Holladay and agreed upon by all, the minutes of the previous meetings were approved as written.

First United Methodist Church:

Mr. James Gray appeared before the Council to request that a letter be drafted to the Harris County Board of Zoning Adjustments to support the request by the church for a variance in the setback requirements for the planned addition to the church.

Mr. Holladay made a motion that the letter be written.

Ms. Sullivan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Harris County Environmental Issues Committee:

Mrs. Tammy Pierce, the Pine Mountain representative to the Harris County Environmental Issues Committee, appeared before the Council to report on the progress made by the committee and to urge the Council to consider a community recycling project. Mrs. Pierce presented some ideas on where to lease the proper equipment for such a project.

Roofs - Town Hall and Police Station:

Mr. Franklin Davenport, General Superintendent, reported to the Council that a representative of B & A Roofing had inspected the roofs of both buildings and stated that the roof of the Town Hall needs some repair and the roof of the Police Station needs replacing.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion that bids be taken on both buildings.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Water and Sewer Ordinance - First Reading:

Mayor Edgar presented the first reading of the Water and Sewer Ordinance.

Water Shed:

Mr. Holladay reported to the Council that the yards of Mr. Jerry Teasley and Dr. Mack Clements are often flooded during rains from water draining from the Carriage Gate development.

Mr. Holladay made a motion to pursue getting easements to place a line in order to correct the situation.

Ms. Sullivan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
