

Acts of the Council
September 9, 1991

The City Council of the Town of Pine Mountain met in regular session on the evening of Monday, September 9, 1991 at seven o'clock P. M. in the Town Hall.

Mr. Vance C. Smith, Mayor Pro-Tem presided with Councilpersons J. R. Beall, Franklin D. Boykin, P. C. Holladay and Patricia E. Sullivan in attendance.

Minutes - August 12, 1991:

Upon motion by Mr. Holladay, seconded by Mr. Beall and approved by all, the minutes of the August 12, 1991 meeting were approved as written.

Elected Officials Dinner:

Mr. Smith announced to the Council that Pine Mountain will host the next Elected Officials Dinner at the Conference Center Dining Room at Callaway Gardens on September 19, 1991 at 6:30 P. M.

Request for Option:

Mr. Charlie Rowe appeared before the Council to request an option on two cemetery lots. Mr. Rowe plans to sell spaces in a mausoleum to be constructed in the Pine Mountain cemetery. Mr. Rowe wishes to option the lots for a year at which time, the mausoleum will be constructed if the spaces have sold.

Mr. Holladay made a motion to grant a twelve month option at ten per cent of the cost of the lots.

Ms. Sullivan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Contract - Government Surplus:

Mr. Franklin Davenport, General Superintendent, appeared before the Council to request permission to enter into a contract which will allow the Town to purchase surplus government materials.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion that the contract be signed.

Mr. Holladay seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Water and Sewer Rate Ordinance:

Changes made by the Town Attorney in the proposed water and sewer rate ordinance were pointed out to the Council and other changes were discussed.

Request for Service:

Mr. Smith read a request for service from Deborah Branch on Abbie Shepherd Drive for water service.

Mr. Boykin made a motion to grant service to Ms. Branch.

Mr. Holladay seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Streets - Mountainbrook:

Mr. W. Kendrick Askew appeared before the Council to explain that the streets in Mountainbrook had never been deeded to the Town and to inquire if it was the pleasure of the Council that the streets be so deeded.

Mr. Boykin made a motion to accept the streets.

Mr. Holladay seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
