

Acts of the Council
January 13, 1992

The City Council of the Town of Pine Mountain met in regular session on the evening of January 13, 1992 at seven o'clock P. M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor James V. Edgar presided with Councilpersons J. R. Beall, Franklin D Boykin, P C Holladay and Patricia E. Sullivan in attendance.

Minutes - December 9, 1991 and January 6, 1992

Upon motion by Ms Sullivan, seconded by Mr Holladay and agreed upon by all, the minutes of the December 9th and January 6th meetings were approved as written.

Area Agency on Aging:

Mrs Meg Bradley of the Area Agency on Aging appeared before the Council to explain that she had made a mistake at the previous meeting and wanted to request that Pine Mountain assume the cost of meals for two people in FY 92/93.

Mr. Holladay made a motion to contribute \$1,200.00 in FY 92/93.

Ms. Sullivan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Springdale Farms Subdivision:

Mr. Frank Heard appeared before the Council to discuss the annexation of Springdale Farms Subdivision. Mr. Heard introduced Mr. Mark Calhoun, his attorney, to further discuss annexation.

Pine Mountain Tourism Association:

Mayor Edgar announced to the Council that the trolley will be housed in the fire truck bay at City Hall during the months of January and February.

Ms. Carol Bowman, President of the Pine Mountain Tourism Association appeared before the Council to present a report and answer questions. A further report will be given at the April meeting.

Beer and Wine Applications - Second Reading:

Mayor Edgar gave the second reading of applications.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to grant the off premises license to the Corner Shop Food Store.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to grant the on premises license to Moe's and Joe's Sportsman's Grill.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Dead Trees:

Mr. Franklin Davenport, General Superintendent, told the Council of several dead trees which need to be removed.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to have the trees taken down.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Light at Police Station:

Mayor Edgar discussed the need for a security light in the parking lot at the Police Station.

Mr. Beall will investigate the placement and make a recommendation at the next meeting.

Police Car:

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to give Chief of Police Carl David White the authority to order a new police car on the Georgia State Contract in the amount of \$12,400.00.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Ordinance for Establishing Building Permits, Electrical Permits, Plumbing Permits, Mechanical Permits, Gas Permits and Reinspection Fee Second Reading:

Mayor Edgar gave the second reading of the Permits and Fee Ordinance.

Mr. Beall made a motion to enact the ordinance.

Ms. Sullivan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Zoning Ordinance - Additions:

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to enact the additions to the Zoning Ordinance.

Mr. Beall seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Water and Sewer Ordinance:

Mr. Beall made a report on his progress of a water and sewer rate study.

Table for Meeting Room:

Ms. Sullivan made a motion that Country Woodcraft be asked to build a new table for the meeting room.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Reports - Water Department and Fire Department:

Water Department:

Mr. Davenport reported that the monitoring clock at the sewerage treatment plant has broken and cannot be repaired.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion that a new monitoring clock be purchased for \$3,950.00.

Mr. Beall seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Fire Department:

Mr. Davenport reported to the Council that there are now eighteen certified firemen. Mr. Davenport also reported that the hose have been tested and six lengths burst under pressure. It will cost \$837.00 to replace these hose.

Ms. Sullivan made a motion to replace the hose.

Mr. Boykin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
