

ACTS OF THE COUNCIL

May 10, 1993

The City Council sat in regular session on the evening of May 10, 1993 at seven o'clock P. M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor James V Edgar presided with Councilmen Franklin D Boykin, P C Holladay and Vance C Smith in attendance.

Minutes - April 12, 1993:

Upon motion by Mr Holladay, seconded by Mr Smith and unanimously voted upon the minutes of the April 12, 1993 meeting were approved as written:

Pine Mountain Tourism Association:

Mr Jack Drescher of the Pine Mountain Tourism Association appeared before the Council to present the first quarter report.

Precision Planning:

Mr Jerry Hood of Precision Planning, Inc. appeared before the Council to present various options for expanding the wastewater treatment facilities. Precision Planning will present a proposal for the expansion as soon as possible.

Pine Mountain Volunteer Fire Department:

Reverend Wayne Holloway appeared before the Council to present the needs of the Pine Mountain Volunteer Fire Department.

Water Request:

Mr Harry Boyd appeared before the Council to request water service for Lot 5, Meadowsprings Subdivision.

Mr Boykin made a motion that the service be granted.

Mr Smith seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Al Boyd:

Mr Al Boyd appeared before the Council to discuss the paving of the Gardenview Extension.

Annexation Application:

Mayor Edgar gave the first reading of an application from Mr Vance C Smith, Sr for the annexation of certain of his property on Georgia Highway One South.

Subdivision Ordinance - Second Reading:

Subsequent to the second reading of the Subdivision Ordinance; Mr Holladay made a motion to pass the ordinance.

Mr Smith seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Resolution:

Upon motion by Mr Boykin, seconded by Mr Holladay and agreed upon by all, a Resolution to Protest Unfunded Federal Mandates was passed.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

A RESOLUTION ON UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES

WHEREAS, unfunded federal mandates on State and Local governments have become increasingly extensive in recent years; and,

WHEREAS, such mandates have, in many instances, added to growing deficits in State and Local budgets and have resulted in the need for Local governments to increase revenue or curtail services; and,

WHEREAS, such excessive fiscal burdens on local governments have undermined, in many instances, the ability of local governments to achieve their responsibilities under State laws and Local ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, Congressman Gary A Condit (D-CA) has introduced H. R. 140, the Federal Mandate Relief Act of 1993; and,

WHEREAS, this legislation would assure that the federal government pays the total amount of direct costs incurred by state and local governments in complying with certain requirements which take effect on or after the date of enactment of the Act under a Federal statute or regulation; and,

WHEREAS, this legislation would provide that any requirement under a federal statute or regulation that a state or local government conduct an activity (including a requirement that a government meet national standards in providing a service) shall apply to the government only if all funds necessary to pay the direct costs incurred by the government in conducting the activity are provided by the Federal Government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Pine Mountain, Georgia supports H.R. 140 as introduced by Congressman Gary A Condit and goes on record as endorsing this bill;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Town of Pine Mountain, Georgia requests that you co-sponsor H.R. 140 and request from the members of the House Government Operations Committee to immediately pass this legislation.
