

ACTS OF THE COUNCIL

November 14, 1994

The Town Council of the Town of Pine Mountain sat in regular session on the evening of November 14, 1994.

Mayor James V Edgar presided with Councilpersons Richard Beall, Franklin D. Boykin, Vance C Smith, Sr and Patricia E. Sullivan in attendance.

PINE MOUNTAIN TOURISM ASSOCIATION:

Mr Jack Drescher of the Pine Mountain Tourism Association appeared before the Council to present a report on the Heritage Festival.

GARBAGE TRUCK:

As no bids had been received on the garbage truck, the matter was postponed.

MIXED DRINKS APPLICATION:

Mayor Edgar read an application from Mr Ivy Messer for a license to serve mixed drinks at San Marcos Restaurant.

Ms Sullivan made a motion to grant the license.

Mr Boykin seconded the motion.

Mr Beall voted in favor of the motion.

Mr Smith voted in favor of the motion.

CONDEMNATION ORDINANCE - 808 WEST CHIPLEY:

Mayor Edgar presented the condemnation ordinance for the second reading.

Ms Sullivan made a motion to implement the ordinance.

Mr Smith seconded the motion.

Mr Beall voted in favor of the motion.

Mr Boykin voted in favor of the motion.

BUSINESS LICENSE ORDINANCE:

Ms Sullivan made a motion that the fees charged for F/Y 94-94 be \$75.00 for businesses with 1-100 employees and \$76.00 for those with 100 or more employees.

Mr Beall seconded the motion.

Mr Boykin voted in favor of the motion.

Mr Smith voted in favor of the motion.

RESOLUTION - BIKE TRAIL:

The following resolution was presented for consideration.

WHEREAS; Bicycling is a convenient, healthy, inexpensive and non-polluting form of transportation, and

WHEREAS; Leisure time is increasing for the average citizen, thereby increasing the demand for recreation facilities, and

WHEREAS; Pine Mountain wants to create a bicycle-friendly community to serve the needs of all bicyclists, from

young child to senior citizen and from the racer or tourist to the casual recreational rider, and

WHEREAS; Pine Mountain wants to establish alternative transportation modes for its residents and visitors to our area, and

WHEREAS; Georgia's Transportation 2000 Vision states: "The people of Georgia value a multi-modal transportation system that both recognizes and balances the unique needs of Georgia's diverse geographic regions, and one that supports sustainable economic development and preserves our investments in natural and built environments."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; by the Town of Pine Mountain that bicycle riding is hereby recognized as a potentially significant mode of transportation, worthy of consideration as an integral part of Pine Mountain's and the Chattahoochee-Flint region's transportation system;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that bicycle transportation is encouraged and hereby supported in principal;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Pine Mountain present the proposed Bicycle Route for the Town of Pine Mountain to the Georgia Transportation Commissioner, Wayne Shackelford, for consideration into the State Bicycle Plan;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Pine Mountain would like to see Pine Mountain, Roosevelt State Park, and Warm Springs joined as part of the State System of Bicycle Trails.

Mr Beall made a motion to adopt the resolution.

Mr Boykin seconded the motion.

Mr Smith voted in favor of the motion.

Ms Sullivan voted in favor of the motion.

INSURANCE ORDINANCE - FIRST READING:

Mayor Edgar presented the first reading of an insurance ordinance.

L.O.S.T. CONTRACT:

There was discussion of the contract presented by Harris County covering the Local Option Sales Tax distribution.

The matter was delayed.

WATER RATES:

A water rate table was presented to be studied and discussed at the next regular meeting of the Town Council.

SIGN ORDINANCE:

Mayor Edgar appointed Mr Boykin and Mr Beall to formulate a new sign ordinance to be introduced at a later time.

PROBATION SERVICE

The subject of a probation supervision service was introduced for study and action at a later date.

After discussion from the floor, the meeting was, by mutual consent, adjourned.
