

ACTS OF THE COUNCIL

June 9, 1997

The Town Council sat in regular session on the evening of June 9, 1997 at seven o'clock P. M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor James V. Edgar presided with Councilpersons J. Richard Beall, Franklin D. Boykin, W. Mitchell Chason, P. C. Holladay and Jarvis M. Shepherd in attendance.

ACTS OF COUNCIL

Mr. Holladay made a motion that the Acts of the Public Hearings and the Council meeting of May 12th be approved as written.

Mrs. Shepherd seconded the motion.

Mr. Beall, Mr. Boykin and Mr. Chason voted in approval of the motion.

PUBLIC HEARING - BUDGET

The Council meeting was closed at 7:02 .

A Public Hearing was opened for discussion of the budget.

There was no public comment.

The Hearing was closed at 7:04 P. M.

Mr. Holladay made a motion that the General Funds budget of \$508,810.70 and the Enterprise Funds budget of \$186,409.85 be passed as presented.

Mr. Beall seconded the motion.

Mr. Boykin, Mr. Chason and Mrs. Shepherd voted in favor of the motion.

PINE MOUNTAIN TOURISM ASSOCIATION

Ms. Hank Arnold appeared before the Council to present the tracking report for May.

Ms. Arnold also presented the 97/98 contract between the Town of Pine Mountain, the Pine Mountain Tourism Association and Callaway Gardens.

Mr. Beall made a motion that the contract be signed.

Mr. Holladay seconded the motion.

Mr. Boykin, Mr. Chason and Mrs. Shepherd voted in approval of the motion.

SPEED LIMIT - SPRINGDALE FARMS

Mr Irving Blair appeared as spokesman for the Springdale Farms Subdivision to request that the Council set speed limits of 20 to 25 MPH on their road.

Chief of Police Carl D. White recommended a limit of 25 MPH be set on Springdale Drive.

Mr Holladay made a motion that a speed limit of 25 MPH be set for Springdale Drive and the appropriate signage be erected.

Mrs. Shepherd seconded the motion.

Mr. Beall, Mr. Boykin and Mr. Chason voted in agreement with the motion.

CHIPPER

Mayor Edgar announced to the Council that Pine Mountain has received a grant for the purchase of a chipper to be used for the recycling of yard waste.

SEWERAGE TREATMENT

Mayor Edgar announced to the Council that the bid opening for the construction of the Underground Treatment Application will be held in the Town Hall at 2 P.M. on June 26, 1997.

Several citizens commented on various matters to include the Askew Triangle, Pine Mountain Volunteer Fire Department bar-be-cue and a July 5th celebration and sale in downtown Pine Mountain.

Mr. Boykin made a motion that the meeting be adjourned.
