The Mayor and Council of the Town of Pine Mountain sat in a regular session on the evening of Monday, December 12, 2016 at 7:00 P.M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor James W. Trott, Jr. presided with Councilpersons Josephine Bray, Tamara M. Pierce, Mary R. Mullins and Warren S. Aldrich in attendance. Keith Pendergrass was not in attendance.

ACTS OF COUNCIL

UPDATED RADAR LIST FOR THE TOWN OF PINE MOUNTAIN-Chief Daniel Ferrone

The Town of Pine Mountain is hereby requesting that the following roadways be approved for the use of speed detection devices.

Attached is the updated radar list for the Town of Pine Mountain that reflects the 35 mph speed zone along State Route 1/18 through downtown. The radar list also reflects the inclusion of previously annexed sections of State Route 1 and State Route 354.

The Town of Pine Mountain will be responsible for proper speed zone sign placement on non-state route roadways corresponding to this list as well as any advisory speed warning signs roadway conditions warrant.
