ACTS OF COUNCIL

Ms. Mabry made a motion to approve the Acts of Council for the February meeting(s) as written.

GMEBS LIFE & HEALTH PROGRAM RELATED TO RETIREE-ONLY COVERAGE HEALTH/DENTAL PLAN-Austin Gibson

Mr. Gibson explained that the Town's personnel manual shows that the Town pays for retirees' (55 years of age with 10 years of service) health/dental plan, however the declaration that GMA has does not show that. The declaration needs to be amended to include that.

Mr. Trott made a motion to amend the policy to offer eligible retirees this coverage.
