**MAY 11, 2026**  
**7:00 P.M.**

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Pine Mountain sat in a regular session on the evening of Monday, May 11, 2026, at 7:00 P.M. in the Town Hall.

Mayor Mary Ruth Mullins presided with Councilpersons James W. Trott, Jr., Curtis Bray, Stokeley Pound, Frankie Mabry, and Thomas E. Scott in attendance.

**PRAYER**

Rev. Tony Lattimor opened the meeting with prayer.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Tommy Ellison, with Boy Scout Troop 40, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ACTS OF COUNCIL**

Ms. Mabry made a motion to approve the Acts of Council for the April meeting(s) as written.

Mr. Pound seconded the motion.

Mr. Trott, Mr. Scott, and Mr. Bray voted in favor of the motion.

**FINANCIAL REPORT**

Mayor Mullins presented the financial report for April.

**PINE MOUNTAIN TOURISM-Julia Keating**

Mrs. Keating presented the monthly report.

**MAYOR AND COUNCIL INCREASE IN COMPENSATION ORDINANCE-1<sup>ST</sup> READING**

Mayor Mullins presented the second reading for an ordinance to increase Mayor and Council compensation from \$1,800 to \$6,000 annually (Mayor) and \$360 to \$4,500 annually (Council).

Mr. Bray made a motion to approve the increase in compensation.

Mr. Trott seconded the motion.

Mr. Pound and Ms. Mabry voted in favor of the motion.

Mr. Scott voted against the motion.

**CLOSURE OF BROAD STREET-Dean Porter**

Mr. Porter shared his concerns with Mayor and Council about Broad Street being closed. Requested that the business owners be advised when the street request would be on the agenda so they could come and speak in favor or against the request.

**AMENDMENT ALCOHOL FEE SCHEDULE-1<sup>ST</sup> READING-Mayor Mullins**

Mayor Mullins presented the first reading for an ordinance to amend the alcohol fee schedule.

**AMENDMENT WATER AND SEWER RATES-1<sup>ST</sup> READING-Mayor Mullins**

Mayor Mullins presented the first reading for an ordinance to amend the water and sewer rates.

**PROCLAMATION A PURPLE HEART TOWN-Mayor Mullins**

The Purple Heart was the first American service award or decoration made available to the common soldier and is specifically awarded to members of the United States Armed Forces who have been wounded or who made the ultimate sacrifice in combat with a declared enemy of the United States of America.

Mr. John Wilder and Mr. Alan Gibson with the Department of Georgia Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter #492 presented the Mayor with "The Military Order of the Purple Heart Special Recognition Award".

**SHOVEL READY PLAN-Mayor Mullins**

Mr. Trott made a motion for Precision Planning, Inc. to apply for a grant to work on water and sewer in the following locations:

McDougald Avenue and Commerce Avenue

Chipley Street and Harris Street

Gardensview Drive to Malida Creek

Mr. Pound seconded the motion.

Mr. Scott, Mr. Bray, and Ms. Mabry voted in favor of the motion.

**ReLeaf TREE GRANT-Mayor Mullins**

Mr. Trott made a motion to apply for the ReLeaf Tree Grant in the amount of \$15,000 to plant trees, maintenance, and buying trees for the Springdale Subdivision.

Ms. Mabry, Mr. Pound, and Mr. Scott voted in favor of the motion.

**RESOLUTION FOR DOT TO PLACE EAGLE SCOUT SIGNS-Wayne "Chip" Seagle**


Mr. Seagle requested a resolution for DOT to place Eagle Scout signs in Pine Mountain.

Mr. Trott, Mr. Scott, and Mr. Bray voted in favor of the motion.



